1. Can your child draw a picture of their family?
2. Can your child draw a picture of their favourite animal?

5. Can your child trace over the letters in their name?
6. Can your child copy the letters in their name?
7. Can your child independently write their name?
8. Can your child draw a picture of anything they wish to and talk about the marks they make?

Your child could practice the following skills:

- Select a given number of objects from a group when asked, for example, 'please give me two', and 'please give me five'.
- Recite some number names in sequence to 20.
- Use some language of quantities, such as 'more' 'a lot' and 'the same' when comparing an amount of objects.
- Begin to recognise numerals 1-10 and then match amounts of objects to the numerals.
- To sort objects into coloured sets and accurately point count them.
- Recognise 2-D shapes-triangle, square, rectangle and circle.
- Sort objects by size and height.
- Understand positional language such as on top, under, behind, in front and next to.
